

#### **Call to Order:**

Regular Meeting: Call to order made by Commissioner Rogalski at 6:30 p.m.

#### **Introductions:**

Commissioners: Floyd Rogalski, Melissa Becker (excused), Fred Benjamin, Kevin Nicholson and Hartwig Vatheuer. Superintendent: Julie Petersen; Treasurer: Scott Olander; Ancillary Operations: Rhonda Holden; EMS Manager: Geoff Scherer.

#### **Approval of Agenda:**

Action: A motion to approve the agenda was made by Commissioner Nicholson and seconded by Commissioner Benjamin. Motion carried.

#### **Approval of Minutes:**

Action: A motion to approve the minutes of the October 21, 2019 Regular Meeting was made by Commissioner Nicholson and seconded by Commissioner Benjamin. Motion carried.

Action: A motion to approve the minute of the November 4, 2019 Special Meeting was made by Commissioner Benjamin and seconded by Commissioner Nicholson. Motion carried.

#### Public Comments/Announcements/Correspondence:

Commissioner Bill Dickinson from Fire District 7 spoke as a community member and expressed concern about the impression in the community that Hospital District 2 intended to concentrate all of the District's ambulances in the large, new ambulance garage being planned for Cle Elum. Commissioner Dickinson was concerned that concentrating ambulances in Cle Elum would lead to delayed responses for upper county residents. Commissioner Rogalski assured Commissioner Diskinson that District 2 did not intend to concentrate ambulances at the Cle Elum ambulance station and that the District 2 still hoped to base an ambulance and ambulance crew in the District 7 fire station.

#### **Operations Report:**

The Commissioners reviewed the written operations report and operating statistics for October 2019. Geoff Scherer reported that October transports were below budget by 27 transports, a negative variance of 37.5%. YTD we are now 21 transports below budget and 10 transports below the District's 2018 transports, a 1.5% negative variance. Geoff feels that the significant October transport will return to normal levels once winter weather and winter road conditions arrive. Geoff reported that Medic 5 continues to have problems with the AC. Braun worked on the AC unit but it failed before Geoff was able to drive it back to Cle Elum. Braun was called send a driver to pick-up Medic 5 so that they could repair it again.

Geoff is tracking out-of-county transports so that he is able to reimburse crew members for their new per diem meal allowance in accordance with the new labor agreement.

There was discussion regarding ambulance crews leaving the station and eating out at local restaurants. Commissioners are concerned that it appears the crews are not working and not available for transports. Geoff will develop guidelines that encourages crews to have their meals at the ambulance station.

#### Superintendent's Report:

The Commissioners reviewed the written report for November 2019. Julie commented that Hospital District 1 open labor negotiations with WSNA and that we do not expect any problems in reaching an agreement. In addition, she noted that Hospital District 1 voted in two new Commissioners. Julie announced that the move in of Family Medicine of Ellensburg and KVH Pediatrics to the Medical Arts Center is scheduled for February 17, 2020.

Julie asked if District 2 Commissioners would agree to write a letter of support for a 1/10<sup>th</sup> of 1% increase to the Kittitas County Sales tax to support Mental Health Programs in the County.

Action: A motion to approve writing a letter of support to increase Kittitas County Sales taxes 1/10<sup>th</sup> of 1% for Kittitas County Mental Health programs was made by Commissioner Vatheuer and seconded by Commissioner Nicholson. Motion carried.

#### **Ancillary Report:**

The Commissioners reviewed the written report for October 2019.

#### **Finance Report:**

The financial statements for October 2019 were reviewed by the Commissioners. The review included a review of actual versus budgeted revenue and expense variances. As noted in the Operations Report, October transports were below budget by 27 transports and YTD are now 21 transports below budget. The average charge per transport exceeded budgeted average charge per transport so YTD ambulance revenue still exceeds budget by \$26,112. 2019 Total Revenue through October is \$68,478 greater than budget and \$116,587 greater YTD 2018 Total Revenue. YTD Deductions from revenue adjustments were \$245,227 below budget due to receipt of a GEMT payments from the Managed Care Medicaid Insurance Companies. Overall expenses for October

were \$10,724 below budget and YTD are under budget by \$92,118. YTD Net Income is \$462,429 compared to budgeted YTD net income of \$27,573.

Action: A motion to approve the checks for October was made by Commissioner Nicholson and seconded by Commissioner Benjamin. Motion carried.

#### **Open Door Clinic:**

No report.

#### **Ambulance Station:**

Rhonda provided an update about the ambulance station project time line, site plan and floor plan development. Commissioners asked that landscaping around the building follow a minimalist approach that is inexpensive to maintain.

## Ancillary Services report to Hospital District #2 Board of Commissioners December 2019

#### **Ancillary Service Operation Report:**

#### Upper County Growth & Traffic Projections

At the Ambulance Garage Design Team Meeting 12/4, there was concern raised regarding the size of the garage and whether 8 bays and 8 sleep rooms, 11,200 square feet is too large. As a reminder, at the April 2019 Board meeting, we discussed ensuring the ambulance garage would be of sufficient size to support population growth. Per the Washington State Department of Transportation, an average of 28,000 vehicles travel over Snoqualmie Pass daily and these numbers double on weekends and holidays. Traffic volumes are projected to increase 2.1% per year, reaching an average of 41,000 vehicles per day by 2030. The table below, from the Office of Financial Management, displays the projected growth for the towns of Snoqualmie Pass, Easton, Roslyn, Ronald, Cle Elum and South Cle Elum, although this doesn't take into consideration the number of tourists and second home owners in Upper County on holidays and weekends.

We are working with KDA to expand the footprint of the lab on the main hospital campus. With a larger laboratory, we will be able to perform more testing on site.


#### EMS and Trauma Assessment

The final public forum to give input on the EMS and Trauma Assessment will be held on December 12<sup>th</sup> in Wenatchee. Secretary of Health Weisman has asked the steering committee members for their input on the top priorities in the report and finding funding for the entire emergency care system, including cardiac and stroke, was our top recommendation.

#### Hospice Friends

Hospice Friends is considering partnering with KVH to build a Hospice House, a place for residents of Kittitas County facing end of life to be cared for in a family friendly and comfortable environment. CWU has also expressed interest in a larger project in Ellensburg which could include a housing development for the elderly. The annual Tree of Love Ceremony was on December 6<sup>th</sup> in Ellensburg and on December 8<sup>th</sup> in Cle Elum.

**Turnout Time - Dispatch to Enroute** 




#### **Payor Mix by Charges**
